## UPCOMING CHANGES TO STAFF STRUCTURE

The Session of LMPC has approved a restructuring of pastoral responsibilities, effective June 1.

As of June 1, lead pastor Brian Salter will oversee responsibility of all ministry to children, youth, and adults. Chad Middlebrooks, pastor of adult discipleship, and Joe Novenson, pastor of senior adults, will continue to report directly to Brian. Aaron Tolson will assume responsibility of both middle and high school ministry, and Len Teague will remain responsible for children's ministry. Both Aaron and Len will begin reporting directly to Brian on June 1.

In addition, Brian will hand oversight of LMPC's missions program to Frank Hitchings, senior associate pastor. This program includes world missions, home missions, and Love Lookout. Stephanie Young, missions coordinator, will continue to manage the missions program and begin reporting to Frank on June 1. Frank will continue to oversee finance, operations, and worship.

Please pray for our pastors and staff as they adjust to the new structure this summer.
