At just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous man, though for a good man someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

FINANCE

2019 YEAR-END GIVING UPDATE

Praise God for his abundant provision through his people at LMPC. While giving was slightly under budget by approximately \$22,000, we had adequate funds to meet the needs of the church in 2019. Total giving was approximately \$4,859,000 while the budget was \$4,881,000. Giving in 2019 was approximately 2.6% above 2018. Thank you for your generous gifts toward the work of the Kingdom at LMPC.

2020 PLEDGING UPDATE
