Affirmation of faith

Leader: Christians, what do we believe when we pray the Lord's prayer?

All: In faith, when we pray "Give us this day our daily bread," we ask that we may receive and enjoy God's provision in total dependence on him.

In faith, when we pray "Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors," we ask that God, through Christ, would freely pardon all our sins. We are made bold to ask for God's forgiveness because, by his grace, we are enabled from the heart to forgive others.

In faith, when we pray "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil," we ask that God would keep us from being tempted to sin, and support and deliver us when we are tempted.

Call to confession taken from Isaiah 30

This is what the Sovereign Lord, the Holy One of Israel says: "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength, but you would have none of it."

Yet the LORD longs to be gracious to you; he rises to show you compassion. For the LORD is a God of justice. Blessed are all who wait for him! How gracious he will be when you cry for help! As soon as he hears, he will answer you.

Silent prayers of confession

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in him and he in God.


