All: The LORD Almighty—he is the King of glory.




# \* Prayer of adoration and the Lord's prayer

# Assurance of God's pardoning grace

taken from Colossians 2:13-15

When we were dead in our sins and in the uncircumcision of our sinful nature, God made us alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having canceled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.

## Prayer of intercession for those struggling financially

Leader: Holy God, whose crucified and risen Son displays your power made perfect in weakness, dwell in us today and make us a people whose strength and hope is firmly rooted in you. We pray this morning for those who are in the grips of fear and despair over lost jobs, closed businesses, and other financial dilemmas. We take refuge in the words of the psalmist:

All: The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul.

Leader: God of our daily bread, provide for the physical and financial needs of the countless people in our city, country, and world who are unsure of what to do next. Make us your hands and feet to love and serve those in crisis during this time. We take refuge in the words of the psalmist:

All: He guides me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

Leader: God of all comfort and help, be a shelter to those who are overwhelmed by fear and heartache. Draw them to yourself through the generosity and love of your people. Grant them food, shelter, clothing, and job opportunities. We take refuge in the words of the psalmist:

All: You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

# \* Scripture reading from John 19:28-37

<sup>28</sup>Later, knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." <sup>29</sup>A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. <sup>30</sup>When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

<sup>31</sup>Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jews did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down. <sup>32</sup>The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other. <sup>33</sup>But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. <sup>34</sup>Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water. <sup>35</sup>The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe. <sup>36</sup>These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," <sup>37</sup>and, as another scripture says, "They will look on the one they have pierced."

This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Last week we asked: who is on the cross?


This week we ask: what was accomplished by Jesus on the cross?
