

Call to confession James 1:23-26

Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. 
Assurance of God's pardoning grace

Leader: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves.

All: In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding.

Prayer of intercession for those in positions of leadership

Leader: Lord, your word says we are not to put our trust in mortal men who cannot save, but to trust in you. You are the Maker of heaven and earth, yet you graciously use human beings to accomplish your purposes. This morning we pray for those in positions of leadership in our country and around the world. Give them wisdom and understanding, that they might make decisions out of knowledge and true fear of you rather than a desire for the approval of others.

All: Guide national leaders to act out of justice and mercy, that the economic, diplomatic, ecological, and political tasks of government may be ones that honor you.


Leader: Give local politicians discernment and insight as they navigate the hardships and crises in their communities. Empower them to work for the good of all people, and align their efforts with your sovereign will.

All: Grant business owners and leaders of organizations wisdom as they make decisions concerning employees, meetings, travel, and community interaction. Let them be quick to listen to wisdom, and give them the ability to lead their communities faithfully.

Leader: Allow family leaders to encourage, support, and guide their families through the coming months. Grant them peace when they are frustrated, humility when they are headstrong, courage when they are afraid, and strength when they are exhausted.

All: We praise you, Lord, true King of all creation, and pray with the psalmist: "May all the kings of the earth praise you, O LORD, when they hear the words of your mouth. May they sing of the ways of the LORD, for the glory of the LORD is great." Amen.

* Scripture reading from Acts 11:1-18

¹The apostles and the brothers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him ³and said, "You went into the house of uncircumcised men and ate with them."

⁴Peter began and explained everything to them precisely as it had happened: ⁵"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. I saw something like a large sheet being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to where I was. 6I looked into it and saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles, and birds of the air. ⁷Then I heard a voice telling me, 'Get up, Peter. Kill and eat.' 8I replied, 'Surely not, Lord! Nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' The voice spoke from heaven a second time, 'Do not call anything impure that God has made clean.' 10This happened three times, and then it was all pulled up to heaven again. ¹¹Right then three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea stopped at the house where I was staying. ¹²The Spirit told me to have no hesitation about going with them. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³He told us how he had seen an angel appear in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. 14He will bring you a message through which you and all your household will be saved.' ¹⁵As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as he had come on us at the beginning. 16 Then I remembered what the Lord had said: 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.'

¹⁷"So if God gave them the same gift as he gave us, who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could oppose God?" ¹⁸When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted even the Gentiles repentance unto life."


Prayer of preparation for the study of God's Word
