

# Prayer of intercession for Metanoia Prison Ministries

- Leader: O Lord, your Scriptures tell us that because of your great love we are not consumed, for your compassions never fail. They are new every morning, and great is your faithfulness. We pray that your love, your compassion, and your faithfulness would renew and advance the work of Metanoia Prison Ministries.
- All: We ask that you would reveal yourself to men and women in prison who do not yet know you, and draw them into a life-giving and life-changing relationship with you. May they know your unfailing love and boundless grace and put their hope in you. For those who do know you, strengthen their faith and encourage their hearts by your Spirit.
- Leader: We ask that you would protect these men and women from Covid-19, and that, when they feel afraid and helpless, they would find great comfort in you. Be with all who are grieving the loss of loved ones from the pandemic, and continue to give Metanoia wisdom as they seek to minister under such complicated circumstances.
- All: We ask that you would raise up believers to become part of Metanoia's correspondence ministry, and allow new relationships between your people and prisoners to grow. Grant Metanoia access where they currently have none, and provide new opportunities for connection and friendship. We thank you, Lord, for Metanoia's work produced by faith, their labor prompted by love, and their endurance inspired by hope in your Son, Jesus Christ. <sup>22</sup>"And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there. <sup>23</sup>I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. <sup>24</sup>However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace. <sup>25</sup>Now I know that none of you among whom I have gone about preaching the kingdom will ever see me again. <sup>26</sup>Therefore, I declare to you today that I am innocent of the blood of all men. <sup>27</sup>For I have not hesitated to proclaim to you the whole will of God.

<sup>28</sup>"Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood. <sup>29</sup>I know that after I leave, savage wolves will come in among you and will not spare the flock. <sup>30</sup>Even from your own number men will arise and distort the truth in order to draw away disciples after them. <sup>31</sup>So be on your guard! Remember that for three years I never stopped warning each of you night and day with tears. <sup>32</sup>Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

<sup>33</sup>"I have not coveted anyone's silver or gold or clothing. <sup>34</sup>You yourselves know that these hands of mine have supplied my own needs and the needs of my companions. <sup>35</sup>In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

<sup>36</sup>When he had said this, he knelt down with all of them and prayed. <sup>37</sup>They all wept as they embraced him and kissed him. <sup>38</sup>What grieved them most was his statement that they would never see his face again. Then they accompanied him to the ship.


More unmistakable marks of Christian living:
