Our study of Acts for the last several months has shown us over and over how faithfully the Lord provided for his church. Although it faced great opposition and uncertain times, the church persevered, confident in God's mercy and grace and empowered to share the glorious news of the Gospel.

In his first letter to Timothy, the apostle Paul gave thanks to Jesus, "who has given me strength," filled with wonder that the "grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus." (1 Tim. 1:12, 14) We're going to spend two weeks studying a part of this letter with the desire to remind ourselves that we, too, have had the grace of Jesus poured out on us in abundance.
