NEW SERMON SERIES: FAITHFUL IN GIVING, STEADFAST IN MISSION

Our study of Acts for the last several months has shown us over and over how faithfully the Lord provided for his church. Although it faced great opposition and uncertain times, the church persevered, confident in God's mercy and grace and empowered to share the glorious news of the Gospel.

In his first letter to Timothy, the apostle Paul gave thanks to Jesus, "who has given me strength," filled with wonder that the "grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus." (1 Tim. 1:12, 14) We're going to spend two weeks studying a part of this letter with the desire to remind ourselves that we, too, have had the grace of Jesus poured out on us in abundance. Like Christians for centuries, we face an uncertain future, but we are held fast by our Savior and Shepherd Jesus. Let's cling to him, believing that he will enable us to faithfully give so that we can remain steadfast in carrying out his mission on the mountain, in the city, and around the world.

Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

¹¹But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. ¹²Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

¹³In the sight of God, who gives life to everything, and of Christ Jesus, who while testifying before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you ¹⁴to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵which God will bring about in his own time—God, the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, ¹⁶who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see. To him be honor and might forever. Amen.
