Leader: The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.


He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of

to be more like you through the precious blood of Jesus. Amen.


Silent prayers of confession

based on Colossians 1:19-22




Prayer of preparation for the study of God's Word
