

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.



This is the Word of the Lord.



#### WEEKLY ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES: We want to remind our members and our regular attenders that registration is required for all of the Christmas Eve services as well as the nursery being offered at 3:00 and 5:00 p.m. We're hoping to be able to accommodate first-time visitors and people in our community who are unaware of registration, so members who have not registered should plan to watch the livestream at home. In order for us to move a large number of people safely in and out of our church on Christmas Eve, it is very important that everyone abide by the following guidelines:

- Once you have registered, please make note of both the time and the location (sanctuary, chapel, or fellowship hall). Come at the right time, and come to the right place.
- <u>Please arrive NO MORE than 30 minutes prior to each service</u>. Our goal is to have everybody from one service exit as quickly as possible at the end of the service before the group coming to the next service arrives. **Smooth exiting + smooth entering = safe social distancing.**
- Please do not send one person to save seats for your whole group/family. Arrive together—be seated together. It will not be possible to reserve an entire pew or row.

Thank you for your patience and understanding. Like you, we hope that all of these guidelines will be a distant memory next Christmas.
