

Prayer of intercession for our city

- Leader: Be with our home missions partners and bless their ministries for your names' sake. Expand and establish the work of their hands as they trust and serve you.
- All: Merciful God, hear our prayer. We pray now as your Son taught us to pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen."

Prayer of preparation for the study of God's Word


Sermon "True Love of God: Acting Justly, Loving Mercy, and Walking Humbly with Him" Frank Hitchings, senior associate pastor

1. The Lord's just indictment: God's people had grown weary of him even though still going through the motions of religious activity. (vv. 1-5; see also vv. 9-12)

2. The people's revealing response: They would rather leverage than love God! (vv. 6-7)

3. The prophet's piercing rebuke: True love of God lives out what he loves – justice, mercy, and humility. (v. 8)

MEET OUR GUESTS FOR OUR WORLD MISSIONS CONFERENCE 2021

Dr. Lloyd Kim - Keynote Speaker

Dr. Kim was elected coordinator of Mission to the World (MTW) by the 2015 General Assembly. A native of California, he graduated from UC Berkeley with a degree in engineering and worked as a consultant with Ernst & Young before getting his M.Div. at Westminster Seminary in California and his doctorate in New Testament Studies at Fuller Theological Seminary. He was associate pastor with New Life Mission Church (PCA) in Fullerton, California, before joining MTW. He and his wife Eda served as missionaries with MTW beginning in 2004 in the Philippines and then in Cambodia, where they initiated a new church-planting work which grew to a team of 20 working in multiple



sites. Dr. Kim served as MTW's international director of the Asia-Pacific region before his nomination as MTW coordinator in July of 2014.
