
# \* Call to worship




- Leader: The LORD reigns, let the nations tremble; he sits enthroned between the cherubim, let the earth shake.

# Call to confession

based on Isaiah 55:6-7

Seek the LORD while he may be found; call on him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake his way and the evil man his thoughts. Let him turn to the LORD, and he will have mercy on him. Let him turn to our God, for he will freely pardon.

# **Prayer of confession**

- Leader: Heavenly Father, you instruct us in your Word to "trust in the LORD with all our hearts, and lean not on our own understanding." You tell us to "not be wise in our own eyes" but rather "fear the LORD and shun evil."
- All: We confess that we are often half-hearted in our trust and lean more on our own understanding than yours. We act as though we are wiser than you, and are prone to indulge in evil rather than shun it.
- Leader: You tell us in your Word that "the fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline. For the LORD gives wisdom, and from his mouth come knowledge and understanding."
- All: We confess that rather than pursuing the gift of your pure wisdom, we are often content to settle for mere earthly wisdom. Instead of fearing you, we have become lukewarm and show contempt for your commands. Apart from your grace, we are fools who despise your mercy. Heavenly Father, heal our wayward and arrogant hearts, and grant us your wisdom. taken from Proverbs 3:5, 7; 1:7; and 2:6

#### \* Scripture reading from Genesis 29:31-30:24

<sup>31</sup>When the LORD saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb, but Rachel was barren. <sup>32</sup>And Leah conceived and bore a son, and she called his name Reuben, for she said, "Because the LORD has looked upon my affliction; for now my husband will love me." <sup>33</sup>She conceived again and bore a son, and said, "Because the LORD has heard that I am hated, he has given me this son also." And she called his name Simeon. <sup>34</sup>Again she conceived and bore a son, and said, "Now this time my husband will be attached to me, because I have borne him three sons." Therefore his name was called Levi. <sup>35</sup>And she conceived again and bore a son, and said, "This time I will praise the LORD." Therefore she called his name Judah. Then she ceased bearing.

<sup>1</sup>When Rachel saw that she bore Jacob no children, she envied her sister. She said to Jacob, "Give me children, or I shall die!" <sup>2</sup>Jacob's anger was kindled against Rachel, and he said, "Am I in the place of God, who has withheld from you the fruit of the womb?" <sup>3</sup>Then she said, "Here is my servant Bilhah; go in to her, so that she may give birth on my behalf, that even I may have children through her." <sup>4</sup>So she gave him her servant Bilhah as a wife, and Jacob went in to her. <sup>5</sup>And Bilhah conceived and bore Jacob a son. <sup>6</sup>Then Rachel said, "God has judged me, and has also heard my voice and given me a son." Therefore she called his name Dan. <sup>7</sup>Rachel's servant Bilhah conceived again and bore Jacob a second son. <sup>8</sup>Then Rachel said, "With mighty wrestlings I have wrestled with my sister and have prevailed." So she called his name Naphtali.

<sup>9</sup>When Leah saw that she had ceased bearing children, she took her servant Zilpah and gave her to Jacob as a wife. <sup>10</sup>Then Leah's servant Zilpah bore Jacob a son. <sup>11</sup>And Leah said, "Good fortune has come!" so she called his name Gad. <sup>12</sup>Leah's servant Zilpah bore Jacob a second son. <sup>13</sup>And Leah said, "Happy am I! For women have called me happy." So she called his name Asher.

<sup>14</sup>In the days of wheat harvest Reuben went and found mandrakes in the field and brought them to his mother Leah. Then Rachel said to Leah, "Please give me some of your son's mandrakes." <sup>15</sup>But she said to her, "Is it a small matter that you have taken away my husband? Would you take away my son's mandrakes also?" Rachel said, "Then he may lie with you tonight in exchange for your son's mandrakes." <sup>16</sup>When Jacob came from the field in the evening, Leah went out to meet him and said, "You must come in to me, for I have hired you with my son's mandrakes." So he lay with her that night. <sup>17</sup>And God listened to Leah, and she conceived and bore Jacob a fifth son. <sup>18</sup>Leah said, "God has given me my wages because I gave my servant to my husband." So she called his name Issachar. <sup>19</sup>And Leah conceived again, and she bore Jacob a sixth son. <sup>20</sup>Then Leah said, "God has endowed me with a good endowment; now my husband will honor me, because I have borne him six sons." So she called his name Zebulun. <sup>21</sup>Afterward she bore a daughter and called her name Dinah.

<sup>22</sup>Then God remembered Rachel, and God listened to her and opened her womb. <sup>23</sup>She conceived and bore a son and said, "God has taken away my reproach." <sup>24</sup>And she called his name Joseph, saying, "May the LORD add to me another son!"

Prayer of preparation for the study of God's Word


Sermon "Life's Truest and Deepest Need: God and His Grace" Joe Novenson, pastor of senior adults

- 1. God's people, not understanding their deepest need, often make idols out of good things.
- 2. God, fully knowing our deepest needs, gives his grace even in the face of our sin.

Application: What we learn about our truest and deepest need

- No human relationship will ever fulfill our deepest need—only God and his grace can.
- All attempts to fill that need with anything but God and his grace are certain to collapse under the massive weight of our over-expectations and over-inflated hopes.
- God's grace not only comes <u>to</u> the unwanted ones of the world, but it also comes <u>through</u> the unwanted One, rejected by the world.
