Deuteronomy 1:1-8

¹These are the words that Moses spoke to all Israel beyond the Jordan in the wilderness, in the Arabah opposite Suph, between Paran and Tophel, Laban, Hazeroth, and Dizahab. ²It is eleven days' journey from Horeb by the way of Mount Seir to Kadesh-barnea. ³In the fortieth year, on the first day of the eleventh month, Moses spoke to the people of Israel according to all that the LORD had given him in commandment to them, ⁴after he had defeated Sihon the king of the Amorites, who lived in Heshbon, and Og the king of Bashan, who lived in Ashtaroth and in Edrei. ⁵Beyond the Jordan, in the land of Moab, Moses undertook to explain this law, saying,

⁶"The LORD our God said to us in Horeb, 'You have stayed long enough at this mountain. ⁷Turn and take your journey, and go to the hill country of the Amorites and to all their neighbors in the Arabah, in the hill country and in the lowland and in the Negeb and by the seacoast, the land of the Canaanites, and Lebanon, as far as the great river, the river Euphrates. ⁸See, I have set the land before you. Go in and take possession of the land that the LORD swore to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give to them and to their offspring after them.'"

NEW SERMON SERIES – DEUTERONOMY: COVENANTAL CLARITY

Dr. Bruce Waltke said, “Deuteronomy is the most important book in the Old Testament.” Why? First, it is written by Moses to make the covenant relationship clear. Second, it informs the theology of Israel’s prophets and enables them to interpret Israel’s history, both its judgment and its hope for restoration. Third, Jesus quotes this book more than any other book of the Bible. Deuteronomy is quoted in the New Testament over 53 times - a number exceeded only by Isaiah and Psalms. And yet, the contemporary church largely neglects it.

As we ask for the renewal of our hearts before the face of God, our study of Deuteronomy will help us understand the nature of the covenant and what covenant renewal might look like. Clearly, Jesus loved this book. And when you love someone, you enjoy reading what they love and enjoy. So, let us hear, enjoy, and respond to our Covenant God.
