Leader: Love is patient, love is kind.

WORLD MISSIONS PROJECT SPOTLIGHT: THE UK PARTNERSHIP

The United Kingdom Partnership (UKP) was established in 2013 by Reverend Ed Norton, Pastor of Global Outreach at Independent Presbyterian Church in Memphis, and our own Senior Associate Pastor, Frank Hitchings.

The UKP seeks to help foster and fund indigenous church planters in the United Kingdom who hold to the tenets of the Reformed faith. The UKP has no paid staff or financial accounts, and there is no fee to join. It exists solely to connect Reformed US churches with Reformed UK church planters, primarily from the Free Church of Scotland, The International Presbyterian Church, Evangelical Presbyterian Church in England and Wales, and The Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches.

Since 2013, Reformed US churches in the partnership have given over \$3,000,000 for that purpose. There are currently 26 US partners and 22 UK planters. Though the financial support of US churches is a key component of the UKP, the partnership is about far more than money. It is about establishing relationships.
