LIGHTING THE ADVENT WREATH

In the mid-19th century, German theologian Johann Hinrich Wichern was the first to weave evergreen boughs into a wagon wheel adorned with candles as a way for children to count the days until Christmas. Since that time, Advent wreaths have grown in meaning and use as a devotional and liturgical tool for Christians to celebrate Advent. The Advent wreaths we are using at LMPC are full of symbolic meaning: the circular shape reminds us of God's never-ending love; the evergreen branches point to God's promise of eternal life through his Son; the red holly berries signify Jesus' blood shed on the cross; and the candles of hope, peace, joy, love, and Christ himself remind us of the true Light of the World, whom the darkness can never overcome.

ADVENT 2022 SERMON SERIES HEBREWS: WHAT CHILD IS THIS?

Advent is all about waiting and longing for redemption. Hebrews is all about confirmation that Jesus is the One we have all been waiting on. As the hymn lyrics ask, "What child is this, who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, while shepherds watch are keeping?" This child, Jesus, is the one who fulfills all of the longings built up through the prophets, temple, priesthood, and sacrificial system. Jesus is the exact representation of God and is everything God wants to say to us. Jesus is the new, final, and superior High Priest and Royal Son. Jesus is superior to the angels. All the longings of the covenant people of God find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ. And though he has come, still we wait. We await his return when he will completely consummate the glory of his unshakable and eternal Kingdom on earth. Until then, let us wait with eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith.

1. God speaks: the anticipated Word of God in the last days (vv. 1-2a)

- 2. God authoritatively speaks in his Son: the identity of the living Word (vv. 2b-3a)

• Jesus is the mighty creator and powerful sustainer.

- 3. God clearly speaks in his Son: the message of the living Word (v. 3a)
 - Jesus is the radiant glory and exact representation.
