Affirmation of the law: the fifth commandment

Leader: What is the fifth commandment?

All: The fifth commandment is: Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you.

Leader: What does the fifth commandment require?

All: The fifth commandment requires us to respect and treat others, whether above, below, or equal to us, as their position or our relationship to them demands.

Leader: What does the fifth commandment forbid?

All: The fifth commandment forbids being disrespectful to or not treating others as their position or relationship to us demands.

Leader: What is the reason for the fifth commandment?

All: The reason for the fifth commandment is the promise of long life and prosperity, if these glorify God and are for the good of those who obey this commandment.

Call to confession 1 John 1:8-9

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

Prayer of confession

Leader: O great God, you are three in one: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. How gracious you are to grant us, as your image-bearers, the honor of reflecting your perfect authority and your Son's humble obedience in our homes and in our lives.

All: Lord, whether in private or in public, forgive us for dishonoring the authorities that you have allowed in our lives. Forgive us for our rebellion, both by refusing to honor those in authority over us and by refusing to honor those over whom we have authority.

Leader: Father of lights, infuse our daily routines in every sphere of life with love and obedience as we seek to serve each other in your name.

Teach us to parent our children lovingly and faithfully, and to be children who delight to worship you by showing respect and honor to our parents.

All: Lord, forgive us for neglecting the fruits of your Spirit by treating our parents with impatience, unkindness, and even contempt. We ask that you would reshape our hearts and minds to honor you as our Eternal Father, despite the pain or confusion we have experienced from our earthly parents. And may our hearts be quick to forgive, as you have forgiven us.




