### Affirmation of the law: the ninth commandment

Leader: What is required in the ninth commandment?

All: I must not give false testimony against anyone, twist no one's words, not gossip or slander, nor condemn or join in condemning anyone rashly and unheard. Rather, I must avoid all lying and deceit as the devil's own works, under penalty of God's heavy wrath. In court and everywhere else, I must love the truth, speak and confess it honestly, and do what I can to defend and promote my neighbor's honor and reputation.

The Heidelberg Catechism, question 112

taken from Ephesians 4 and 5

I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Be imitators of God, as dearly loved children, and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

### Prayer of confession

Leader: Our Creator and Redeemer, your spoken Word brings order, beauty, and light where there is chaos, emptiness, and darkness. We thank you for the power of your Word in creating the world and in making us a new creation in Christ.

All: We confess that our words are often riddled with falsehood, misrepresentation, and manipulation. Forgive us for speaking in ways that produce death rather than life, rivalry rather than friendship, and blame rather than repentance.

Leader: We twist, distort, and dodge the truth in order to justify ourselves, protect our interests, and tear down others.

All: Forgive us for our words that spread harm and that dishonor you.

May the Word of Christ dwell in us richly so that the words of our mouths and the meditations of our hearts please you, our Rock and our Redeemer.

### 2. The meaning of the commandment

- Negatively: The command rejects all forms of lying, deceit, slander, gossip, and destructive words.
- Positively: The command promotes integrity, transparency, and honesty as essential ingredients of biblical community.
- Broadly: All sin breaks the ninth commandment since all sin rejects truth, behaves according to lies, and often seeks to hide and cover up sinful behavior.

### 3. The hope for forgiveness and formation

- Convicted on false charges, the Truth died on the cross to set liars and hiders free.
- Empowered by the Spirit, believers are to prize and promote all that is true.
