"Chosen, but Not Choice" Chad Middlebrooks, pastor of discipleship

- 1. The rationale behind God's choice (vv. 7-8)
 - It has nothing to do with Israel's qualifications. (v. 7)
 - He loves because he loves. (v. 8)
- 2. The character behind God's choice (vv. 9-10)
 - He is faithful to a thousand generations of those who love him. (v. 9)
 - He repays those who hate him. (v. 10)
- 3. The right response to God's choice (v. 11)
 - God's gracious choice and loving character motivate us toward obedience.
