WORLD MISSIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE: JUBA

Join your World Missions Committee in praying for the people of Juba, South Sudan. South Sudan has struggled for years with conflicts that have weakened its institutions, causing many other problems such as economic crises, corruption, and nepotism. Fighting, which broke out in April 2023, is a great threat, as it will worsen the economy and security of the country. Thousands of Sudanese and South Sudanese are fleeing the war, entering Juba. The population is increasing rapidly, causing demand to exceed supply. The threat of a famine is looming. The World Missions Committee recently approved a gift of \$10,000 to assist with relief efforts. Not only will these funds assist with the purchase and distribution of food supplies, but through our partnering agency, Bibles will be provided so more than 300 households will see the goodness of God and hear the Gospel, to strengthen their faith and remain hopeful. Thank you to the members of LMPC: your tithes and offerings make gifts such as these possible.

Deuteronomy 8:11-20

¹¹"Take care lest you forget the Lord your God by not keeping his commandments and his rules and his statutes, which I command you today, ¹²lest, when you have eaten and are full and have built good houses and live in them, ¹³ and when your herds and flocks multiply and your silver and gold is multiplied and all that you have is multiplied, ¹⁴then your heart be lifted up, and you forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, ¹⁵who led you through the great and terrifying wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water, who brought you water out of the flinty rock, ¹⁶who fed you in the wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know, that he might humble you and test you, to do you good in the end. ¹⁷Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.'

¹⁸"You shall remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your fathers, as it is this day. ¹⁹And if you forget the LORD your God and go after other gods and serve them and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish. ²⁰Like the nations that the LORD makes to perish before you, so shall you perish, because you would not obey the voice of the LORD your God."
